These traits are what makes our ministry unique and have begun to identify where we are headed and how we will be known going forward. Consider how these ideals can guide your daily interactions and decisions.

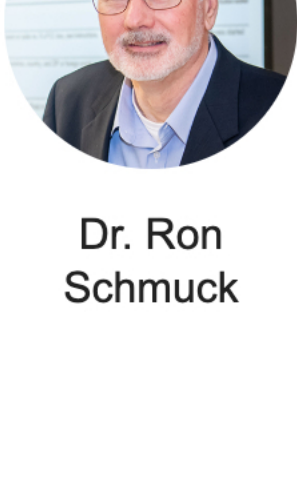
Rings

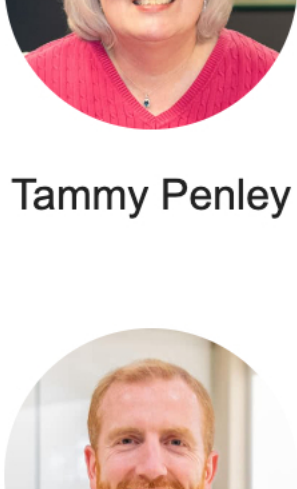

A gift of a classic desk clock was given to acknowledge timely personal investment by several of your colleagues.



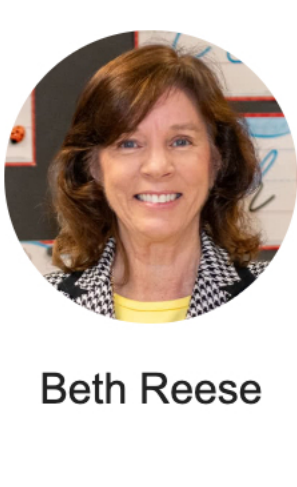
Josh Beam

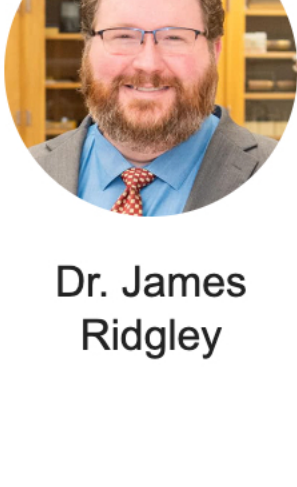
Dianah Canada

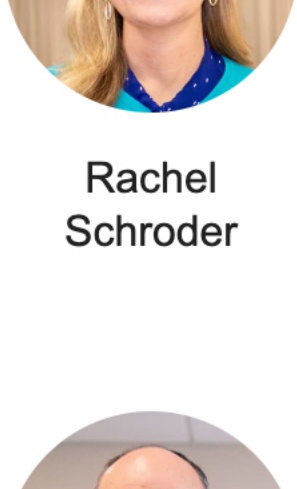
Penny Dosson

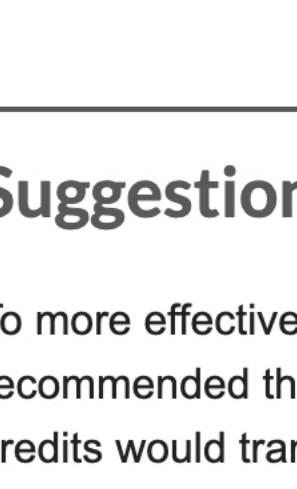
Bobby Gonser

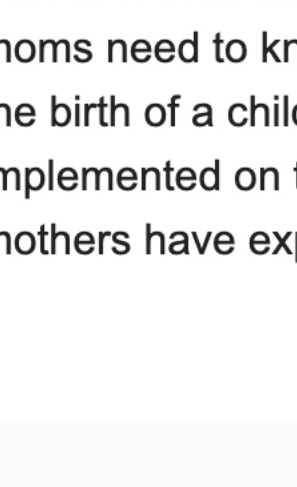
Jake Long
