Academics

PCC students benefit from a comprehensive approach to higher education, including built-in support both in and out of the classroom. This holistic college experience is guided by the biblical worldview and curated for student success.

Student Success Advisors provide ongoing advice and support, helping students plan their schedules to ensure they stay on track for graduation and monitoring academic progress throughout the semester. They also provide major-specific career advice and help students connect with other college departments to get questions answered when needed. Students can connect with their advisor through go.pcci.edu/StudentSuccessAdvisor.

Faculty have weekly office hours that are posted on Eagle's Nest and in their course syllabi. If students have questions or need help in a particular course, they can drop by the faculty offices or contact their teacher to set up a meeting.

Foundations for College Success is a one-credit course all first-semester students take to help provide a smooth transition to college. Students will learn to use PCC's academic resources and develop skills that contribute to academic success like study methods, time management, and career prep.

Canvas is an online platform students use to access course syllabi, view course resources, and submit projects. Additionally, students can send class-related questions to their faculty members through Canvas.



Tutoring and **academic coaching** are available free of charge through PCC Care, collegians, and student volunteers who can share their expertise. Students can search “tutoring” on Eagle’s Nest for more information.

Spiritual Growth

Chapel provides students an opportunity to cultivate their faith. Four times a week, students hear from guest speakers who have a passion for the next generation.

Student-led prayer groups meet weekly in each residence hall and across campus, providing students the opportunity to grow together in their faith.

Christian Service groups go out into the Pensacola area weekly to minister to the local community. With over 55 service groups to choose from, Christian Service is a great way for students to show the love of Christ to the community.

Mission Projects occur every year to raise money for missions. Students can get involved by donating, volunteering, or simply praying.

Student Body Projects allow students to directly impact the community around them, through hurricane cleanup, toy drives, and volunteering at local non-profit organizations.

Resources

Eagle's Nest is the online hub that students will use more than any other. On Eagle's Nest, your student can stay up to date on campus life, class grades, and student email. Because Eagle's Nest is so integral to campus life, encourage your student to become familiar with its features and to check email daily.



Authorized Access is your way of getting an inside look at college life! You'll be able to view campus events and chapel services, and your student can grant you access to even more Eagle's Nest features. You can request this service at pcci.edu/AuthorizedAccess.

The **myPCC** app, available on both the App Store and Google Play, gives students quick, easy, and mobile access to Eagle's Nest features, from dining menus and class grades to package notifications.

Office 365 is freely available to all students. In addition to using Office 365 for class projects, students can use the computer labs and PaperCut printer kiosks located across campus for their printing needs. For more information on using Office 365 and on-campus printing, students can search "Tech Help Central" on Eagle's Nest.

The **Rebekah Horton Library** provides digital and print resources for personal and academic research. The library's Research Center, located on the first floor, answers students' reference questions and helps them develop effective research skills.





The **Sports Center** is a great place for students when they need a break from studying. Students can bowl, climb the rock wall, ice skate, and use the water park—all at no cost.

At **West Campus**, students can enjoy water activities and picnicking with friends. Catamarans, kayaks, paddle boards, and picnic areas are available free of charge.

All facility hours and guidelines are available on Eagle's Nest.



For students who need help but aren't sure where to start, **QuickConnect** provides fast access to college resources and support services. Students can use QuickConnect via the widget on Eagle's Nest or by calling 855-53-MyPCC (855-536-9722).





Services

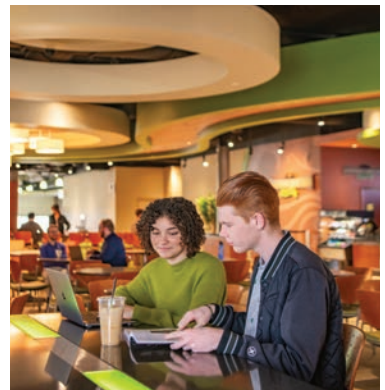
The **IT Help Desk** stands ready to assist students with technology issues or questions, including help with Wi-Fi. Students can get the help they need by searching “Tech Help Central” on Eagle’s Nest, emailing **StudentTechHelp@pcci.edu**, or visiting the IT Help Desk on the third floor of the Administration Building.

Dining Services, guided by an executive chef, offers students a variety of wholesome and quality food selections. The Varsity and Four Winds facilities provide buffet-style service, including an allergen-free line. Grab N Go is a student favorite: on-the-go salad, deli, and hot meals are available, as well as a get-well meal. All three dining options are included in room and board.

For a change of pace, students can visit or mobile order from **The Palms** (with options from The Grille, Papa Johns, and Chick-fil-A) or **Common Grounds Café**, both located in the Commons.



You can even order a treat for your student! Download the Transact mobile ordering app at go.pcci.edu/MobileOrder.





The **Campus Store**, located in the **Commons**, sells school supplies, gifts, Eagles clothing, music, snacks, drinks, and more. Students can purchase items in-store or online via the Transact app for pickup. Additionally, each residence hall stocks everyday essentials in smaller shops: the Gearbox (men's residence halls) and the Pelican (women's residence halls).



Treat your student! Visit go.pcci.edu/StudentFunds to add funds to your student's PCC Card. It works like a debit card at campus retail locations and vending and laundry machines. You can also order a care pack for exams, holidays, or just because at cstore.pcci.edu.

Eagle Express Cleaners, collaborating with Modern Dry Cleaners and located in the Campus Store, allows students to drop off dry cleaning and laundry by the pound (10 lb. minimum).

The **shopping shuttle** runs each Saturday to local stores for \$2 per round trip. A free on-campus work shuttle is available on weekdays for students at work locations like PCA and the Print Shop. Students can find more information about this service by searching "shuttles" on Eagle's Nest.





The **Graf Clinic** is an on-campus healthcare provider independently operated and staffed by Baptist Medical Group of Pensacola. A doctor or nurse practitioner is available by appointment during regular clinic hours.

For residence hall students, visits to the Graf Clinic are covered by the Health Services fee and do not require proof of insurance. Fees incurred for on-campus labs, diagnostic testing, and pharmaceuticals will be applied to the student's account at the time of service. Pharmaceuticals and off-campus medical facilities may require insurance cards/fees which the student would be responsible for.

After-hours medical needs and serious illnesses or injuries are referred to off-campus medical facilities associated with one of three area hospitals. For emergency medical assistance, Safety and Security (850-479-6595) has trained medical responders available 24/7.

The Graf Clinic also offers rides to off-campus medical appointments for students without access to transportation. Students can submit a Medical Transportation Request at eaglesnest.pcci.edu/MedicalTransportation.



The Pensacola area offers three major hospitals, several urgent care centers near campus, and numerous medical offices. Be sure you and your student are familiar with these medical facilities and have a plan in case of emergency. Safety and Security

CAMPUS SECURITY

PCC works diligently to ensure the campus is safe for your student. The main campus operates as a gated community with security checkpoints at all entrances.

All buildings on campus are equipped with security systems and procedures. For further security measures, buildings such as residence halls are accessible only by student PCC Card, and desk workers verify authorized entrance.

Local deputies, campus security officers, and trained staff keep campus and buildings secure 24/7.

EMERGENCIES

Emergency notification systems and meticulously planned emergency procedures ensure every student's safety. To access our emergency plans, see [emergency.pcci.edu](https://www.pcci.edu/emergency).



Students will automatically receive **Critical Alerts** via email, text, and voice call in the event of a weather or campus emergency. These alerts keep students informed and provide any necessary action steps to be taken.

PCC partners with Escambia County Emergency Operations Center to receive minute-by-minute information about local emergencies.

In the event of a campus emergency, we will post public statements on our website, [pcci.edu](https://www.pcci.edu), and on social media to inform you about circumstances and actions taken. PCC Emergency Operations responds to all on-campus emergencies, prioritizing student protection, safety, and care through tailored plans for a variety of scenarios.

All buildings are intentionally constructed to withstand hurricane-force winds.

PCC Care

A strong support system is critical to every student's success. At PCC, students will find curated resources to guide them on the path to graduation.

When your student has that “I don't know what to do” moment, the PCC Care Office is here to provide the best support.

Through PCC Care, students have convenient and free access to safe, impartial, and confidential services.

The **Academic Success Office** provides tutoring, coaching, and writing support to give students the tools they need to succeed.

Biblical guidance advisors offer students a listening ear, prayerful encouragement, and advice that is rooted in Scripture. For students who need long-term or specialized support, PCC Care can provide referrals to an off-campus counseling center.

Campus Parents help first-time students adjust to college life. Many of our staff, faculty, and Campus Church members volunteer as Campus Parents to provide their Campus Kids support throughout the school year. Students interested in benefiting from this program can email CampusParent@pcci.edu.

Student Mentors are available to help first-time students with the knowledge, skills, and mindset needed for success. Your student can find a mentor by searching “student mentors” on Eagle's Nest.

Career Services is committed to students' professional success. Through this office, students receive help with résumés and cover letters, interview preparation, and connecting with employers.

PCC Care also provides **disability services** by helping students who have documented disabilities. For students needing academic and housing accommodations, they can apply by searching “disability services” on Eagle’s Nest.

A **financial advisor** is available to help students navigate scholarships, on-campus work programs, and loan options. Students can make an appointment to see the financial advisor to get the help they need.
