From the President

Some students come to us with much Christian "polish"; others come from unbelieving, secular backgrounds, and not much "polish." Recently, a student wrote me telling how he came to PCC and to encourage us to keep on training students for the Lord. I quote from his letter:

"A home school mom who uses the *A Beka* curriculum told me about a publishing company that was run by a college ministry called PCC. In a few days, she brought me the catalog. As soon as I opened it, I knew this was where God wanted me to attend college! I prayed for my father's approval for two weeks straight, and God changed his 'no' to a 'yes.' I was thrilled!....

"Since I have come to PCC, I have learned so much! I cannot believe how quickly the time is going by!

"Academically, I have learned to do my best. I have learned that there is actually a beginning of time (Creation), that God made all of the trees, animals, and human beings separately and for a purpose. This may sound trivial, but it has been a breakthrough for me—a stark contrast from what I was taught in public school! I have learned that God is the Creator of all the subjects I study!

"Socially, I have learned to mature in being the correct, godly gentleman that God wants me to be. Also, He has shown me how to care for, love, and regard others higher than myself.

"I have also had many struggles. My parents often mock me for my faith in Christ and attending such a 'narrow-minded school.'..."

As this young man stays close to the Lord, God will help him in his struggles and will make him a better witness for Christ. I'm glad that God takes the surrendered raw materials of His children to make beautiful jewels for His crown. What a joy to train young people for God's glory.

PCC's *Eagles* wrestling team placed fifth in the National Collegiate Wrestling Association tournament held at Lafayette College in Easton, Penn. In their respective weight classes, Ben Bieber (*Wisc.*) took second and Steve McGettrick (*Wash.*) placed third.

Previously, the *Eagles* won first place at the NCWA Southeastern Conference tournament at Catawba College in Salisbury, N.C. Five wrestlers had first place finishes with Matt Fitch (*Ohio*) named Outstanding wrestler. Coach Jim Hazewinkel was named conference "Coach of the Year."

WPCS-fm (89.5), the flagship of the *Rejoice Broadcast* Network, started with only a dream; in 1969, Dr. Horton applied for FCC approval to operate an educational Christian radio station. Later, July 22, 1971, WPCS was on the air locally for 17 hours a day, broadcasting from an unused elementary classroom.

Great advances took place in the 1980s: broadcasting 24 hours, satellite capability, a new tower with increased coverage, and the move into new studios at the Communicative Arts Center on the PCC campus.

The station has remained fully automated, has never carried commercial messages, and is supported by gifts from listeners. Greg Moses, PCC graduate, began working in WPCS in 1982 and became operations manager in 1994. In 1996, he assumed the responsibilities of general manager.

That same year the Rejoice Broadcast Network first aired on a translator station in Eugene, Oregon. Today, RBN reaches throughout the upper Gulf Coast, the many areas of the country through 61 translator stations, and around the world on the Internet at www.rejoice.org. Listeners write from New Zealand, Saipan, Korea, Germany, Canada, Scotland, Brazil, and Nigeria about the spiritual encouragement and blessings that Rejoice Radio

PCC has been involved in both radio and television ministries for many years. Rejoice in the Lord telecast is videotaped during the Campus Church services.

> The television outreach to the Pensacola area began in March 1982. One year later, it expanded to 24 stations and took the name Rejoice in the Lord. In 1988, Jim Schettler became the pastor. The telecast continues to be listener supported, and is carried on 35 stations at major markets across the country that include such cities as Atlanta, Dallas, Phoenix, Seattle, and Boston. It is also carried on Satellite and the Internet.

The Campus Church's move to Crowne Centre was a major television challenge, but the camera volunteers quickly learned to work with the new cameras, a much larger stage, and a new sound system. It is a great encouragement when many viewers write and share the blessings the telecast brings to them.

Dr. Jim Schettler's enthusiastic messages bless and challenge viewers across the nation and around the world via Internet.
